Our Year 6 representatives also take on the significant responsibility of being our Pupil Parliamentarians. They will have similar duties to that of 'Head Girls and Boys' and be significant leaders in our school. ## Medication and allergies

We must also ask that children are never sent with medication in their bags as there have been occasions in other schools where children have had medicine on site and have misplaced it during the school day. This can obviously be very dangerous. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.



## Friends of King Edwin

Many thanks to the troop of parents that worked hard last year to provide much needed funds for school and much appreciated entertainment for our children. The 'FOKE' was as successful as ever last year and we are hoping it will continue to grow from strength to strength this term as we prepare for our next school event. Proceeds from our FOKE fundraising have been used to purchase a new projector and sound system for the hall, a few new iPads for children and I am pleased to say that our clubs are now heavily subsidised to the extent that at the moment they are free of charge. The work of the FOKE team really does make a difference in our school and I am very grateful for their support. I have many other ideas in the pipeline for our homework provision however and I will be sharing new arrangements with you over the coming months.
