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Reading Diaries

All children should now have received their school reading diary. In addition, children have been given a reading book and a sheet of paper with the Oxford Reading Tree characters on. Please support your child at home to familiarise themselves with the names of each of the characters.


Every time your child reads their school reading book at home, please record this in their reading diary. As well as reading your school book, you can record sharing a bedtime story, reading the key words (see pages 121 onwards in the reading diary), looking at signs, reading menus, going on word hunts etc. Any form of reading counts towards reading! You can also backdate any reads to the week beginning the 7th of September as children have only just received their diary.

We have a display in the classroom for our 'Bookopoly' whole school reading challenge. By reading at home your child will be rewarded with a certificate for achieving 20, 40, 60 and 80 reads. We will be displaying the children's reading achievements on the display.
