## Uniform Exchange

On Wednesday & Thursday 20th and 21st July we will be holding our 'school uniform exchange' days to support our families in reducing uniform costs and to promote the idea of a more sustainable future. The economic and ecological cost of buying new uniform every year is high and many parents have responded positively to the suggestion of holding such an activity.

On these last two days of term children will be able to wear non school uniform if they so wish to. Parents are encouraged to bring any old uniform in plastic bags, clearly labelled in order to be exchanged for other uniform of a larger size.

Children will place the bags outside of their current classroom at the end of the day. We must ask parents not to rummage through the bags ...it will be a case of collecting what is required from outside the classroom and leaving accordingly. Hopefully this will see uniform recycled and reduce the costs somewhat for the next academic year.

Clearly not all uniform will be recycled but we sincerely hope that families take up this opportunity.

We must emphasise that all clothes should be <u>clean and prewashed</u>. <u>No underwear</u> should be included in the bags. Each bag needs a <u>clear label identifying the age group and size</u> of clothes within it. <u>No shoes</u> are to be shared either (although feel free to arrange exchanges on our social media pages if you wish to do so).

With the support of one of our KingEdwinner parents, Mrs Hynes, all of the garments that are not claimed will be donated to the Salvation Army Charity with some garments kept as spares.

## KEPS Parking Concerns

Every week we seem to be approached by members of the public concerned about the parking situation near school. We are no different to many schools around the country but nevertheless, I must speak out about my disappointment at the ongoing flouting of rules that are designed to keep children safe.

As a dad of two wonderful children that I love more than anything, I cannot possibly comprehend how I would feel if anything bad ever happened to them as a consequence of a car/traffic incident near school. I'm certain that every parent reading this letter would say exactly the same. We all love our children.

This message is not a 'dramatic over exaggeration of facts' it is clear reflection of exactly how dangerous some of the driving and parking near school has become. I am now 'begging' families to take my advice and to park safely, legally and with the best interest of our little KingEdwinners at heart.

- ONLY PARK IN THE CAR PARK—NOT ON THE PAVEMENT
- DRIVE CAREFULLY AND SLOWLY NEAR SCHOOL
- DO NOT PARK ON THE T JUNCTION
- PARK SENSIBLY IN THE CARPARK
- DO NOT USE THE STAFF CARPARK UNLESS PREARRANGED
- DO NOT WALK THROUGH THE STAFF CARPARK
- PARK CONSIDERABLY AND NEVER PARK ACROSS THE DRIVE OF OUR SCHOOL NEIGHBOURS

The fact that I am even writing this in our newsletter is very disappointing. I feel absolutely certain that I would never have to repeat such a message with the children at King Edwin. Whilst the message is only aimed at a few parents, it is incomprehensible that our messages seem to be falling on deaf ears.

Once again... I ask every parent to consider our message very carefully and help us to make the roads around King Edwin Primary School as safe as possible.
