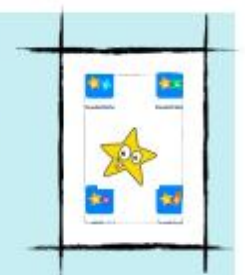

Homework

Homework is a key part of learning in Year 6 and will always be planned to reinforce work in class. We would appreciate your support in encouraging your child to complete homework tasks as it does embed skills they have learnt in class. The majority of this homework will be using the technology children are so enthusiastic to use:

- Maths - Weekly Doodle Maths embedding work in class.
- English - Weekly Doodle English working on fundamental GPS skills (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling).
- Spellings - the children will receive weekly spellings to learn on a Friday. The following Friday, they will then be tested on these words. These spellings will also be set on Doodle Spell weekly.
- Bingo Homework - please see the next page (or our website) to find out this half term's BINGO homework. As you will see, there is some cross over in the activities and the expectations for homework mentioned above (Doodle Maths for example). There are also some additional tasks linked to our civil war unit of learning. We hope the children have fun in completing some of the BINGO homework tasks.

Which side would you be on and why?</p> 	<p>Activity 8: Reading: Log onto TEAMS and look under 'Assignments'. You will find a reading task to complete. Read the extract (Civil War) out loud into the computer. It will work out your accuracy and fluency, giving you a percentage score.</p>
