

Homework is a key part of learning in Year 6 and will always be planned to reinforce work in class. We would appreciate your support in encouraging your child to complete homework tasks as it does embed skills they have learnt in class. The majority of this homework will be using the technology children are so enthusiastic to use:

- Maths Weekly Doodle Maths embedding work in class.
- English Weekly Doodle English working on fundamental GPS skills (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling).
- Spellings the children will receive weekly spellings to learn on a Friday. The following Friday, they will then be tested on these words. These spellings will also be set on Doodle Spell weekly.




