Activity 1:

Doodle Platforms:

Activity 2:

Reading for pleasure (4 times a week):

Warhorse, When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit, Goodnight Mr Tom, Carrie's War, Letters from the Lighthouse, The Lion and The Unicorn, Code Name Bananas, Back Home, A Soldier's Friend.



Activity 3:

Reading Progress:

How accurate is your reading?
How many words per minute do you read? Access assignments in TEAMS and complete the 'Reading Progress' activity which is a summary of WW2.



Activity 4:

Each week you are going to be given **spellings** to learn. Practise these (including on Doodle) to ensure you get more than 80% every Friday morning. These should be written down in your diary and will be on TEAMS each week. Why don't you also work through the Year 5/6 Spellings in your diaries? Get a parent to test you and tick/highlight them off when you have got them correct.

Activity 5:

WW1 or WW2?

Which war was the deadliest?

Which war lasted the longest?

Who was Prime Minister during WW1 and WW2?

Produce a fact file which compares the two wars.



Activity 6:

Find out about a significant person during one of the wars, and prepare a presentation about them, ready to share with the class: Winston Churchill, Lord Kitchener, Archduke Franz Ferdinand, Adolf Hitler, Neville Chamberlain, Anne Frank or someone not mentioned in this list.



Activity 7:

Rationing:

During WW2, food was rationed. Can you find out how much food a family was allowed (per week), and then bake something with the ingredients? For example, bread pudding, corned beef hash, spam fritters, stew, shortbread, jam tarts, pear crumble, rock cakes, soups etc. <https://the1940sexperiment.com/100-wartime-recipes/>

Activity 8:

Art:

Make a model of a WWII plane, a tank, a submarine or any other WW1 or WW2 vehicle. You can use Lego, cardboard boxes, or how about sketching one for our wall display.
