Congratulations to all those who produced wonderful homework last half term. A new bingo homework has been uploaded to MS Teams so let's see


what incredible contributions you make this half term!

Encouraging and nurturing a love of **reading** is something that all KEPS staff are very passionate about. In support of this, classrooms open early at 8:50am on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays to provide additional opportunities for our children to read. We also have brilliant new library facilities in school and all children in Year 3 are invited spend time during the week making informed choices about what to read and discussing these choices with others to share recommendations.

In **English**, we use a 'book study' technique to develop and refine reading and writing skills. Our focus text this half term is 'Ug: Boy Genius Of The Stone Age' by Raymond Briggs. Other fiction books on this subject that you might like to explore are:

- 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura.
- 'Stig of the Dump' by Clive King.
- 'The Boy with the Bronze Axe' by Kathleen Fidler.
- 'How to wash a Woolly Mammoth' by Michelle Robinson and Kate Hindley.

- · 'The Wild Way Home' by Sophie Kirtley.

In Maths, we continue to explore a variety of operations using increasingly more complex numbers. Each week these skills are put to the test in our Times Tables Rock Stars, Fluent in 5, Rapid Reasoning and problem solving challenges. Rehearsing mental recall of key facts is important.



Quick reminders:

- ✓ Drop off and pick up are busy times for staff who are ensuring that every child is safe and hand over is smooth.
