## Dear Parents and Carers,

## Attendance and Punctuality

We have almost had a 'full house' since the start of term and almost every child has arrived on time, ready to start their sessions. We must **emphasise the importance of attendance and punctuality**. Our expectations are that children attend school all day every day whenever possible.

Some term time holiday requests have been received by the school office and all of them are classed as **unauthorised**. I must remind parents that the school follows the local authority attendance policy and as such we may issue fines to families when holidays are taken during term time. Fines issued by the LA do not produce income to the school and in fact they simply add additional workload. We must stress that holidays in term time are not permitted and support from parents on this matter is very much appreciated.

It is a great little App that can often help answer some of those tricky questions for parents.
