



Welcome back after the summer break and also welcome to Key Stage 2! We hope you have had a lovely summer break.

We have put a newsletter together all about Year 3 which we hope you will find useful.

Year 3 is the first year group in Key Stage 2.

The Staff working within Year 3 are:

- Teachers Mrs Cox, Miss Trolley and Miss Moore
- Teaching assistants Mrs Fletcher and Miss Booth
- Throughout the week, many of the Year 3 pupils will also be taught by Miss Kemp, Mrs Willis and Mrs Munnoch

Each half term has a specific 'Unit of Learning' which will focus on different subject areas. We teach in a creative and cross-curricular way where possible. The teaching of Computing is incorporated across the curriculum, providing children with opportunities to use the Internet for research, to write and test simple computer programmes and to present their work in a variety of ways. The chart below indicates the main focus for each half term.

### Routines:

School begins at 9:00am and finishes at 3:30pm

Teachers are available to talk to if something important needs to be discussed and will be in their classrooms from 8.50am. If you require a longer period of time to talk to the teacher, please arrange a convenient appointment for you both.

If a different person will be collecting your child from school (even if this is a family member) please let a staff member know or call the office if this is a last minute arrangement. WE WILL NOT ALLOW YOUR CHILD HOME WITH ANYONE IF WE HAVEN'T BEEN TOLD, EVEN IF WE KNOW THIS PERSON.

Water is available for the children to drink throughout the day. A water bottle needs to be provided from home and we ask that it is water and not juice that it is filled with. Water bottles will be sent home daily to be cleaned.

Children are encouraged to bring in a healthy snack (preferably fruit) for morning break as they won't receive the free piece of fruit like they did in Key Stage One. They may be hungry as their lunch time is later at 12:30pm.

The children will receive homework in a 'bingo' style format. Some of these projects will be set as 'assignments' on our Teams platform but this will be made clear on the homework information shared. Each homework activity will relate to what the children are learning about and they can choose which activities they would like to complete and when. Activities are chosen to insight a love of learning and a thirst for knowledge. Homework should be viewed as a chance for children to play to their strengths - if they are brilliant on the computer - do it on the computer, if they are artistic - let them show that. Children who complete their homework will be rewarded for each piece they do and will receive a certificate to reflect how many pieces they have completed. In addition to this, we also encourage the children to access the DoodleMaths/English/Spelling and Time Table Rockstars (TTRS) learning platforms. We will be sending home spellings for your child to learn on a weekly basis. These will be assessed weekly. These words typically link to the spelling rule focus for that particular week but also expose the children to the statutory words for Year 3 and 4. Please find some time to practise these with your child.

Our school Twitter is a great way of getting to see some of the fabulous work that your child does in school (#classof2027). The bingo homework, letters and updates will be shared via email and on our Teams pages. # English:

The children are taught English in their class groups. Throughout the year the children are presented with numerous opportunities to read and write a variety of genres. The skills learnt in these lessons are rehearsed regularly in writing opportunities across the curriculum and sometimes linked to our unit of learning work.

Children are expected to write in a neat, joined style with letters formed correctly and resting on the lines.

## Reading:

We love reading at King Edwin Primary School! Reading books at home is something the pupils should be experiencing every single day. We ask that parents read with their children daily and record this in their reading diaries. Please also talk about their reading book to ensure they have a good understanding of what they have read. Please use the word lists in the diaries to practise reading sight words.

Your child will be able to change their school reading book when they have read their book and this has been recorded in their diary. The children are expected to change their reading book as and when needed. Please ensure your child's reading book and diary come to school every day as they may read with adults.

In addition, all children will visit KEPS School Library once a week to access a wider range of reading materials and will be able to select a book from here too.

## Phonics/spelling:

The children will take part in daily spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions. The children will consolidate phonemes and rules that they have learned in KS1 and will start looking at further spelling rules and patterns. As in Year 2, we encourage the children to apply their phonics skills within their learning including reading and writing.

#### Maths:

An important aspect of Mathematics is being able to work mentally. In Year 3, we will start to work more on application and problem solving. To support the children's learning in the classroom we will be setting 'extras' on DoodleMaths which will be part of their bingo homework. Please encourage your child to complete these.

### P.E.

Physical Education is a compulsory and vital part of your child's education. We ask that kit is brought into school in a bag that your child will change in to. Your child should have the following basic kit in order for them to fully participate in weekly PE sessions:

- White t-shirt
- Navy shorts
- Trainers / pumps

In addition we would also like you to provide:

Blue/grey/black hoody/fleece and tracksuit bottoms during cold weather

Please ensure that all kit and school uniform is clearly labelled. Earrings need to be removed in order for children to take part in PE as staff cannot remove these. Long hair should also be tied back. Our PE days are *Mondays and Thursdays*.

# How can you help your child at home?

- Read daily with your child and record it in their reading diary, this doesn't always have to be their school book.
- Practising the 3 and 4 times tables.
- Practising weekly spellings
- Practise reading and spelling sight words (in the back of the reading diary).
- Encourage your child to be more independent.
- Learn with them by completing their 'Bingo' homework activities.
- Completing activities on DoodleMaths/English/Spelling and TTRS.
