Living and Growing

As part of our PSHE and Science work, over the last couple of weeks of the year, the pupils in Year 6 will be learning about the human life cycle, how their bodies will change during puberty and sexual reproduction.

Please find below an outline of the work we will be covering.

	<u>Overview</u>	<u>Expectation</u>
Year 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Puberty: to understand some of the physical and emotional changes associated with this time in our lives. 	Describe how and why the body/mind changes during puberty in preparation for reproduction.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Puberty: to identify changes that happen through puberty to allow sexual reproduction in both males and females. 	Talk about sexual reproduction confidently. Explain how babies are made.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know a variety of ways in which the sperm can fertilise the egg to create a baby. 	Understand different ways that babies/children can come into families lives: sexual intercourse, adoption, surrogacy, IVF Describe the decisions that have to be made before having a baby.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know the legal age of consent and what it means. 	Understand the laws associated with sexual intercourse.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the life process of reproduction in humans. 	Know some basic facts about pregnancy and contraception.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To learn where we can get support if we are concerned about our own or another person's safety. 	Speak about phone lines/websites (such as childline) and responsible adults in the pupils lives that they can trust and ask for help/advice.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To address certain gender stereotypes portrayed in the media. 	Discuss different types of adult relationships with confidence.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To know the dangers of the internet – such as sexting, chatrooms, webcams, vidoes and pictures. 	Pupils understand how to act sensibly online – they know how to say “No!” and the dangers associated with social media.

This work fulfils the current guidelines for the teaching of sex and relationships education. As a school, we follow a Life Education program called **SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience, Friendship)** where most of our resources and teaching aids come from. As always, our aim is to answer any question honestly and at a level appropriate to the age of your child.
