PE Lessons


This term, PE lessons will be on Tuesdays and Swimming on Fridays weekly. Please ensure children have the appropriate kits on these days.

Homework

Homework is a key part of learning in Year 4 and will always be planned to reinforce work in class. We would appreciate your support in encouraging your child to complete homework tasks as it does embed skills they have learnt in class. The majority of this homework will be using the technology children are so enthusiastic to use:

*Maths - Weekly Doodle Maths embedding work in class. TTRS is essential in Year 4 (Tables Test)

*English - Weekly Doodle English working on fundamental GPS skills (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling).

*Spellings - the children will receive weekly spellings to learn on a Tuesday. Then, on Friday, they will then be tested on these words.

*Bingo Homework - a few activities will be posted on our TEAMS page linked to our topic. Children will be rewarded for the number of pieces they complete over the half term.
