Year 2 daily routine reminders:

School begins at 9:00am and finishes at 3:30pm. Early bird sessions will continue **Tuesdays - Thursdays** with a Reading, Maths and Spelling focus so doors will be open at 8:50am on these days.

Teachers are available to talk to if something important needs to be discussed. If you require a period of time to talk to the teacher, please arrange a convenient appointment for you both.

If a different person will be collecting your child from school (even if this is a family member) please let a staff member know or call the office if this is a last minute arrangement. We will not allow your child home with anyone if we haven't been told, even if we know this person.

Children are encouraged to bring in a filled water bottle daily. These can be refilled in school if needed. Please ensure your child has their reading book and reading diary with them each day as well as suitable clothing and PE kit to suit the weather conditions.

Each half term has a specific 'Unit of Learning' which will focus on different subject areas. This half term, we will be focusing our Unit of learning on History. We will be learning about the 'Victorians'.

Weather:

As we venture into the Summer Term, and the weather begins to get brighter and hotter, please ensure that your child comes to school readily prepared. If you feel it is appropriate on certain sunny days, please ensure your child is coming to school with applied sunscreen. A hat and a water bottle is advised as your child will be spending break times outside.

Bingo Homework:

The children will continue to receive homework in a 'bingo' style format. Each homework activity will relate to what the children are learning about and they can choose which activities they would like to complete and when. Activities are chosen to insight a love of learning and a thirst for knowledge. Homework should be viewed as a chance for children to play to their strengths - if they are brilliant on the computer - do it on the computer, if they are artistic - let them show that. Children who complete their homework will be rewarded for each piece they do and will receive a certificate to reflect how many pieces they have completed.

Online Platforms:

We encourage the children to access the DoodleMaths/English/Spelling learning platforms. We will continue to send home spellings for your child to learn on a weekly basis in their reading diaries. These will be assessed weekly. Please find some time to practise these with your child.
