

Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools Project

This national project, called the Partnerships for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS for short) focuses on helping schools better identify and address the needs of their neurodivergent pupils.



The project also aims to strengthen partnerships between parent/carers and schools. This important aspect will be supported by Nottinghamshire Parent Carer Forum (NCPF).

PINS seeks to:

- help shape whole school SEND provision,
- provide early intervention at a school level,
- upskill staff, and
- strengthen the partnership between schools and parents/carers.
