Vocabulary	
Soviet Union	Officially the <u>Union of Soviet Socialist</u> Republics (USSR), a nation formerly located in eastern <u>Europe</u> and northwestern <u>Asia</u> . Its capital and largest city was <u>Moscow</u> .
Eastern Bloc	The Eastern Bloc was the group of socialist states of Central and Eastern Europe, East Asia, and Southeast Asia under the influence of the Soviet Union that existed during the Cold War.
Cold War	The Cold War was a period of geopolitical tension between the United States and the Soviet Union and their respective allies, which began following World War II.
Border	A line separating two countries, administrative divisions, or other areas.
EU / NATO	The European Union and the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation are two main treaty-based Western organisations for cooperation between member states, both headquartered in Brussels, Belgium.
Exporting / Importing	Exporting is the sale of products and services in foreign countries that are sourced or made in the home country. Importing is the flipside of exporting. Importing refers to buying goods and services from foreign sources and bringing them back into the home country
