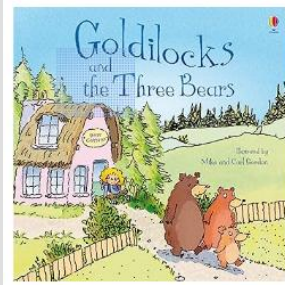

Should Goldilocks Say Sorry?

Our next unit of learning is "Should Goldilocks say sorry?" which is based on Traditional tales with a focus on Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Listening to familiar stories supports children to be able to retell stories through play along with being able to engage with telling the story using the pictures. For this unit of learning we will be tasting porridge, creating role play using the repeated phrases in the story and sorting objects into sizes.

We have introduced a mark making session to encourage children to develop their pre-writing skills. You can help at home by using a range of resources you have at home. Use their finger to copy patterns in flour or rice. Draw pictures in bubbles at bath time. Make patterns with sticks in the soil outside.
