



## Key knowledge

Use clay tiles to recreate a Roman mosaic floor

Research to find examples of Roman mosaic floors.

Use sketchbooks to capture initial ideas of what you want to create.

Roll clay to a given depth and use spatula to mark the clay carefully or add smaller tiles.

Ensure that the marks are clear and allow clay to dry

Seal the final piece with glue and evaluate against initial plans.

| Mosaic    | A mosaic is a pattern or image made of small regular or irregular pieces of colored stone, glass or ceramic, held in place by plaster/mortar, and covering a surface. |
| Tile      | Tiles are usually thin, square or rectangular coverings manufactured from hard-wearing material such as ceramic, stone, metal, baked clay, or even glass.             |
| Clay      | Clay is a type of fine-grained natural soil material containing clay minerals. Clays develop plasticity when wet but can be hardened through firing.                  |
| Malleable | Capable of being changed so as to fit new uses or situations : flexible, adaptable.                                                                                   |
| Research  | Research is defined as the creation of new knowledge and/or the use of existing knowledge in a new and creative way                                                   |
